This year, due to the situation with the pandemic, we are not able to host the annual luncheon. Even though a luncheon is not possible, the community can still come together to support and celebrate with the YCE youth in a virtual event.

In the year of 2019-2020, there are 55 dedicated youth officers lead nine high school clubs continue to serve 15 seniors buildings in SF by teaching over 350 seniors in disaster preparedness and earthquake safety. 

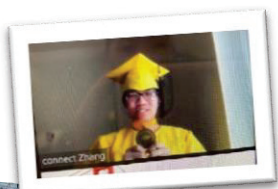
